What all agreed on, however, was that society might be able to prevent future crime by intervening earlier in the process of development that would otherwise produce determined criminal offenders.

Participants must have a criminal history, must abstain from drugs and alcohol. What is surprising to public health professionals, however, is how quickly the attention of criminal justice officials shifts from the victim and his injuries, on the one hand, to concerns about the offender, on the other. This is a loss—particularly in a world seeking to cope with AIDS, in which this collaboration may once more be very important.
